

Firefighting

The Firefighting courses are designed for staff that may be required to deal with fire emergencies in the workplace. The firefighting courses are structured as a developmental program from basic skills and concepts to advanced firefighting techniques.

These courses are aligned to the national standard for the Chemical, Hydrocarbons and Refining Training Package (PMA08), Manufacturing Training Package (MSA07), Public Safety Training Package (PUA12).

Introduction – PUAWER008A: Confine Small Workplace Emergencies

Intermediate - MSAPMOHS212A – Undertake first response to fire incidents

Advanced - PMAOHS213B – Undertake fire control and emergency rescue.

Course Aims

- Develop participants understanding of fire behavior
- Demonstrate and practice correct use of fire extinguishers
- Ensure personnel manage safety during incidents
- Develop team skill when dealing with emergencies

At the completion of the training course participants will be armed with the skills, knowledge and confidence to work safely using fire extinguishment equipment, while also developing sound teamwork skills. The course comprises an equal theoretical and practical component giving participants the opportunity to apply concepts in real situations.

Major Topic Areas

- Principles of fire
- Fire behavior
- Extinguishing medium
- Firefighting techniques

Duration

Firefighting courses are available in three levels (desired pre-requisites):

- Basic/intro – 1 days (no prior training or qualifications)
- Intermediate – 2 days (Basic firefighting or equivalent)
- Advanced – 2 days (Intermediate firefighting or equivalent)
