

# Fire Warden



This course is designed for staff that will form part of the Emergency Control Organisation during an on-site emergency. The course has been developed to cover the broad range of emergencies and workplaces as considered in Australian Standard 3745-2010.

This course is aligned to the national standard for the Public Safety Training Package (PUA12), sub-group of Workplace Emergency Response. PUAWER005B – Operate as part of an emergency control organisation.

## **Course Aims**

- Outline the Fire Wardens role and responsibilities.
- Develop participants understanding of the safe operating procedures during initial response to an emergency
- Introduce equipment used in the role of Fire Warden
- Enable participants to develop confidence operating as a Fire Warden

At the completion of the training course participants will be armed with the skills, knowledge and confidence to work safely and effectively during the initial stages of an emergency on-site, while coordinating the movement of staff within their area of responsibility to safety. The course comprises an equal theoretical and practical component giving participants the opportunity to apply concepts in real situations.

## **Major Topic Areas**

- Respond to emergency reports, signals and warning
- Initiate and control initial emergency response
- Anticipate the further development of emergencies
- Assist with post initial response
- Fire Warden identification and equipment
- Building fire alarms and communications systems

## **Duration**

Fire Warden course:
